The order is for more than €85 million. The signature ceremony took place in the presence of the Ambassador of the Republic of Ghana to Germany, Mr. Grant Ohemeng Kesse, in the Bavarian Representation in Berlin.

Construction of a production plant in Huni Valley, in Ghana

The railway sleepers will be installed for expansion and new construction of the 700-kilometre Western and Central Railway Line in the West African country of Ghana. The line leads from the port city of Takoradi on the southern coast of the country, northward to the border with Burkina Faso. RAIL.ONE Group will construct a sleeper production plant incountry, in Huni Valley, Ghana, with an investment volume of €7 million. The plant, with construction scheduled to begin in mid-2008, will feature



the most advanced in production and plant-facilities technology, and will create 130 new jobs in the region. It is planned to produce approx. 400,000 concrete sleepers annually in this plant. In the construction of such plants, RAIL.ONE draws on its long years of experience in such business. The company is the only provider of industrial systems and solutions that can offer four different production processes for concrete sleepers, which can be modified in accordance with individual project requirements. The combination of plant engineering and production expertise, in addition, guarantees for the customer the required top level of quality standards.
